Additional homework for all children	<p>READING BOOKS – (EYFS – Year 6) Please could both adults and children complete the reading diaries as often as they can? Children do not need to read the whole book at once, a few pages with lots of questioning about what has been read is sufficient. Questioning is key to the new curriculum – checking that the children understand what they have read and discussing any unfamiliar vocabulary. It is also lovely to hear when children tell us about when someone has read a story to them!</p> <p>PHONICS PACKS FOR EYFS AND YEAR 1 – Please practice phonics every week as the children will have a phonic screening test in Year 1. They will need to apply their knowledge of all the sounds in real word i.e. ‘chair’, and pseudo (alien) words i.e. ‘zair’</p> <p>BUG CLUB (EYFS – Year 6) – All children have a bug club login where they can access a range of texts at their appropriate level from home. These books also include questions if they click on the small aliens to check your child understands what they have read. Please check your child’s reading diary for their login details.</p> <p>MATHLETICS – (Year 1 – 6) Children can use mathletics to develop their understanding of all areas of the maths curriculum at a level which is appropriate to them. There are prizes, raffle tickets and certificates for the children/class achieving the most points. For each classes we have just introduced the following prizes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A class will get an additional 5 minutes play if they achieve 5,000 points or more over a week - A class will get an additional 10 minutes play if they achieve 10,000 points or more over a week - A class will get an hour off timetable if they achieve 50,000 points or more. <p>Please check your child’s reading diary for their login details.</p> <p>ROCKSTARS (Year 2 to Year 6) – The new curriculum encourages children to know the times tables. This includes x and ÷ facts. Please encourage your children to use this online resource to practise at home. This resource monitors how many are answered correctly and also keeps a log of the speed the questions were answered in. The aim is to answer all correct in the quickest time!</p> <p>Last year there was a limousine for the winner and theater tickets for second prize.
