PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT:

At Yenton Primary we have a shared philosophy of equality of opportunity and experience for all. We prepare our pupils to be lifelong learners, critical and collaborative thinkers and global citizens, who meet the challenges of life with confidence, optimism and enthusiasm.

We strive to ensure that our children are given every opportunity to realise their full potential regardless of background.

Our key objective is to use the Pupil Premium Grant to narrow the gap between pupil groups and eliminate any barriers to learning.

What is Pupil Premium Funding?






Pupil Premium is an allocation of additional funding (£1320 per pupil) provided to schools to support specific groups of children, who are vulnerable to possible underachievement. These include children who receive free school meals; those looked after by the local authority and the children of armed service personnel. It is provided in order to narrow the attainment gap between those from disadvantaged and more affluent backgrounds.

We use data analysis to identify where gaps need to be narrowed and have a clear aim for what is to be achieved from an intervention. The impact of this is then analysed to make sure it is effective and to see how it could be improved.

To offer pupils opportunities to participate in an enriched wider curriculum to engage and motivate.

Measuring the Impact: Pupil voice, work scrutinies and coaching will show increased engagement of pupil premium pupils, improvement in the quality of cross curricular writing and understanding of context. Pupil Premium involvement in additional experience will be monitored. Development of growth mind set to be shown through social and emotional interaction.



To support pupils identified through internal tracking (S.P.T.O.) who are not making the required progress or are below age related expectations through interventions led by skilled staff; using engaging and researched resources such as Beanstalk volunteers, same day maths catch up (linked to maths mastery), Third Space Learning, English catch up, White Rose Hub maths resources.

Higher teacher to pupil ratios in Y5 and 6 created through the development of additional teaching groups. This is to be used flexibly from the analysis of data and coaching feedback to ensure pupil premium pupils make better than expected progress.

To ensure quality first provision for all through an evaluative coaching cycle and lesson studies based on in house action research to develop staff (led by aspects identified from internal monitoring).

Measuring the Impact: Coaching Logs will show aspects of CPD discussions and development across the year. Pupil Premium Data Analysis - more pupil premium pupils will be at or above age related expectations, continuing to close

the national and in school gap



To support pupils identified through internal tracking (Attendance Team) who are below expectations in attendance and rewards/assemblies/trips to raise the awareness and provide incentives for good attendance.
Measuring the Impact: Pupil Premium attendance data will show a closing gap and increased punctuality, closing the national and in school gap.



To support PP pupils outside lesson times, specifically lunch and playtimes, in order to avoid exclusions and behavioural issues which can disrupt the transition to and from learning sessions.
Measuring the Impact: Pupil Premium behaviour data will show an improvement in the number of issues listed and in turn, improved learning attainment and progress. More PP children participating in extra- curricular clubs at lunchtimes and socialising in an appropriate manner.
