Over the next few days we will take time to digest the information and guidance and will be working hard to ensure that we put everything in place for September to ensure that all of our schools are as well prepared as possible for all pupils to return full time. At the start of the week we shared with you that we will not be reopening schools until the 7th September 2020 - this approach will mean that when we do welcome your child back we will do so secure in the knowledge that everything is in place to ensure that they can quickly start to feel happy and excited about their learning and we can support them in the best way possible.

We know that for many of you, sending your child into school in September 2020 may be a daunting thought but it is important that you know how much we are doing in the background. Our schools have remained open to key worker children and those deemed vulnerable throughout lockdown and, since June, we have accommodated a range of other year groups. Throughout this period we have learned a great deal about effective social distancing measures and constantly sought to refine and improve what we are doing - this approach means that with every additional child and every additional year group we have become more and more secure in how we operate with Coronavirus in the world. In short, we will be ready when September comes and we will be doing everything in our power to make sure schools are fun and exciting places to be.
